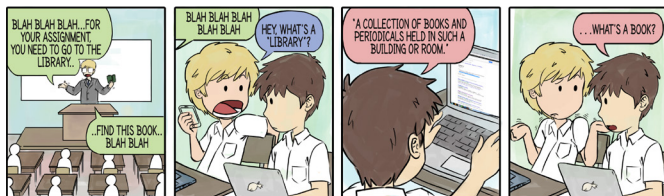

I have been reminded again this week about one of the unique features of Carey, namely, the way it functions as a theological incubator. An incubator is, according to one definition; “an enclosed apparatus or institution providing a controlled environment for the care and protection of premature or unformed ideas.” For this to happen several features need to be present.

First, there must be a controlled environment. Controls are the things that allow us to use things—like the controls of a car. At Carey, we have several ‘controls:’ Holy Scripture, the presence of Christ, the indwelling Spirit, the Nicene Creed, and our Evangelical identity (to name only a few).

Second, an incubator presupposes the development of as-yet unformed ideas and concepts. After all, if you knew it all you wouldn't be here! This is a space to think out loud without recrimination; to work through issues which might be taboo in other contexts; and it is a place to safely learn, debate, dream, and develop deep convictions. I love it! I hope you do too.

But for it to work it requires each of us to play our part: to live out the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, to reflect the love of the Father, and to commit to the fellowship of the Holy Spirit. Happy studying everyone!
