Wish you could preach as well as Andrew Picard in Chapel?

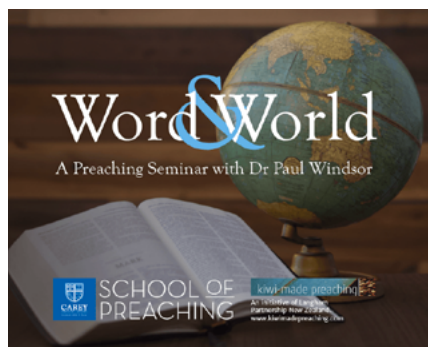
Are you a budding Preacher or been preaching for a while but need a fresh shot in the arm?

## Personal Blind Spots

Last Friday night I experienced the joy of sleeping in the same space with about 120 others (mainly strangers). My earplugs weren't protection from some of the most extraordinary snoring known to humankind. The prince of snorers was 15 metres away. His breathing riot held most of us captive for most of the night. It was high pitched and oscillating, with a unique trumpeting vibrato. It was his 'super-power'. Morning eventually arrived, and I heard him talking to a few who were sleeping alongside. Full of energy, he described how peaceful and comfortable his sleep was. It was a brave soul gently who broke the news that he was now the single most talked about person in the room. His face dropped. It was a personal blind spot—revealed!

Personal blind spots can really impact how others experience us daily. Usually, people won't kindly tell us when we are having a negative impact. Maybe you have a trusted friend who would honestly let you know if you asked, "What is it that I am doing, or not doing that gets in my way?"
